Riches, it would seem, (even on our level) are an hindrance to a relationship with God. Being rich or just 'comfortable' is not a sin. The danger, as we see in today's Gospel, is that wealth and the cares of this world can impede our relationship with God. These material things can demand so much of our time that God is pushed to the margins. It is only when we put God in the first place that all other things fall into order.

The Pope has asked all the lay faithful throughout the world to pray the Rosary in the month of October for the protection of the Church. At the end of the rosary he has asked us to pray the following 2 prayers:

We fly to Thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin.

Holy Michael, the Archangel, defend us in the day of battle, be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust down to hell Satan and all the evil spirits who wander through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.
